Parish Leadership

Leadership Night is held on the second Monday of each month after the 6:00 pm Mass. Anyone wanting to get involved in the parish is welcome to attend. There are five groups that meet on this evening which represent parish organizations and activities. They are as follows:

Formation: The Formation Commission is made up of all levels of educational programming in the parish, children through adults. The role of this group is to foster cooperation, coordination and communication among all groups and individuals involved in the education and formation ministries of the parish.

Worship: The Worship Commission oversees the liturgical and devotional prayer life of the parish in collaboration with the Pastor and the Director of Music. This group envisions balanced liturgical and devotional prayer opportunities that reflect the personal and corporate needs of the assembly and liturgies that lead us to live the Gospel message in work and action, not only in our homes, but in our communities and at the global level.

Parish Life: The Parish Life Commission is made up of various organizations in the parish. Its goal is to build a deeper sense of Christian community for all ages and interest groups in the parish.

Outreach: The Outreach Commission coordinates the ministries of pastoral care, social services, peace and justice and evangelization. Its scope includes outreach to both the parish membership and the larger community, either in the neighborhood or beyond.

Administration: The Administration Commission is responsible for coordinating the temporal affairs of the parish: how money is acquired, how it is spent, how the physical plant is maintained and how parishioners are kept informed about what is happening in the parish.

Formation

How Can I Become Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is the process by which persons age seven and over become Catholic. You enter the Catholic Church through celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. If you were validly baptized in another Christian church, you enter into the full communion of the Catholic Church by making a profession of faith and celebrating the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. How Do I Have My Child Baptized?

Parents are asked to participate in a preparation session before this sacrament is celebrated. The session is conducted at the parish by appointment. The Parish Office should be contacted at least two months prior to the date the baptism is to take place. For more information, please contact Judy Mrozinski.

Why Receive the Sacrament of Confirmation?

The Sacrament of Confirmation more perfectly binds the baptized to the Church. Confirmation completes the Sacrament of Initiation into the Catholic Church and enriches us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit to be a witness of Christ in order to spread and defend the faith by word and deed. Religious Education and Vacation Bible School

St. Joseph's Religious Education classes for ages three to grade eight follow the school calendar, meeting most Sundays from 9:30-10:40 am. Those interested in being a catechist are welcome. It is a great way to grow in one's faith by teaching it to our youth.

Outreach

St. Vincent de Paul

A food distribution is held by the St. Vincent de Paul Society in the Parish Hall on the first and third Saturdays of the month. Food is picked up in Indianapolis at Gleaners and Midwest Foods to be distributed. Volunteers are needed to help pick up food on Thursdays prior to the distribution days. Food is also donated by parishioners and purchased with funding. Set-up begins at 8:00 am with the distribution to the public beginning at 10:00 am.

Jail Ministry
